The **Timeless Group of Companies** was started on PEI in 1994. The company provides custom software solutions to many sectors, including health, legal, financial, manufacturing, non profit, and small business.

Their first product was a software program that helped to schedule sports team games. Since then, they have branched out to cover scheduling in a wide variety of applications, including marina management, elections, emergency response, medical applications, and many more.

Timeless Medical Systems is one division of the company. It develops advanced software applications and IT systems for the healthcare industry.

In addition to developing their own products, Timeless Medical Systems works with other companies and organizations to improve their database management.

Among their many products, they have developed a cancer registry system for the QEH. It allows information to be brought together from many sources so that researchers can analyze data and healthcare professionals can determine best practices. It has also developed a blood management system that tracks blood products.

Their newest product is **MOMS - Mother's Own Milk System**. It manages the collection, testing, processing and distribution of human breast milk to babies in hospitals. The system uses barcoding technologies to collect and store a wide variety of information and ensure the privacy and security of donor data.



Kevin Moase is the Business Development Officer for Timeless Medical Systems, and has worked for the company for three years. He is originally from Summerside, and has a business degree from Mount Allison University. He went on to earn a Certified International Trade Professional (CITP) designation at UPEI.

The staff

Timeless Medical Systems has 10 employees. Seven people work in the office in Charlottetown and the rest work in Halifax. Positions include:

- programers: lead developers, developers, systems architects
- database administrators
- network engineers
- project managers
- quality assurance engineers
- marketing and sales

Training required

“For the programming positions, we usually hire people with university degrees in Computer Science,” says **Kevin Moase**, Business Development Manager. “We may consider a third-year or fourth-year student as we try to match the needs of the company to the person’s education. For marketing and sales, we hire business students with a flair for technology and who can learn on the job.”

Travel

“The jobs can involve a fair bit of travel. Sales people visit clients to do customer support and in-house training. Training can also be done on-line. We also travel to trade missions to do product demonstrations. Occasionally, programmers may also need to travel to customer locations.

“We have a good pool of local talent on PEI, and we draw from that when we can,” says Kevin. “However, this is quite a multicultural work place setting. We have people from Australia, Ireland, and Iran.”
